New Starters

We are almost full in September and I can't believe quite how fast the past year has gone as we prepare to start the transition of the new starters into school. Today we had our new starter coffee morning and after half term we welcome you back into school for your first taster sessions. Monday 10th June or Wednesday 12th June 3.30-4.30pm, Tuesday 25th June or Wednesday 26th June and Thursday 27th June 9.30-11.30am.

Unfortunately, we've had to postpone the Booknic. The field is too soggy after yesterday's rain but we will reschedule it for after half term.

Non School Uniform Day

Friday 24th May is the last day before we break up for half term and what better way to celebrate than with a non-school uniform day. We are raising money for St Luke's Hospice in Winsford so please send your child in with a donation in return for wearing their own clothes.

Sun cream

The sun is starting to make an appearance so please remember to apply sun cream before your child comes to school. Do not send any into school and also ensure they have a named hat, if required, to help protect them

from the sun. Staff don't apply sun cream usually but if it is vital then please see your child's class teacher for a chat over it. Many sun creams now offer adequate protection to 'last' all day'.

Insects

Just a reminder that when the weather gets drier it increases the number of biting critters that seem to live in the forest area. A number of our children appear to be tasty treats for these insects so if your child has Forest School this term please send them in long sleeve tops and long trousers. Last year, I bought some citronella infused bracelets which helped but you may also want to invest in some insect repellant for your child too. Unfortunately, the insects seem to live under the bark in the forest area and become prolific during dry spells and then once it rains the larvae and insects are then dispersed and it becomes less of a problem. We did try and minimize the time spent in the forest area during Forest School sessions last year but if we plan in advance hopefully we can minimize the impact and the discomfort the insects cause.

Head lice

Some classes have had some outbreaks of head lice recently. Dealing with head lice can be challenging, but with the right approach, it's manageable. If your child comes home with lice, start treatment promptly. Over-the-counter treatments are effective and safe when used as directed. In addition to treating the hair, wash bedding, hats, and clothing in hot water to kill any lice or eggs. For items that can't be washed, seal them in plastic bags for two weeks. Combing wet hair with a fine-toothed nit comb can help remove lice and nits. It's also important to check and treat other family members if necessary. Remind children not to share personal items like hats, combs, or headphones to prevent the spread of lice.
